General Information:

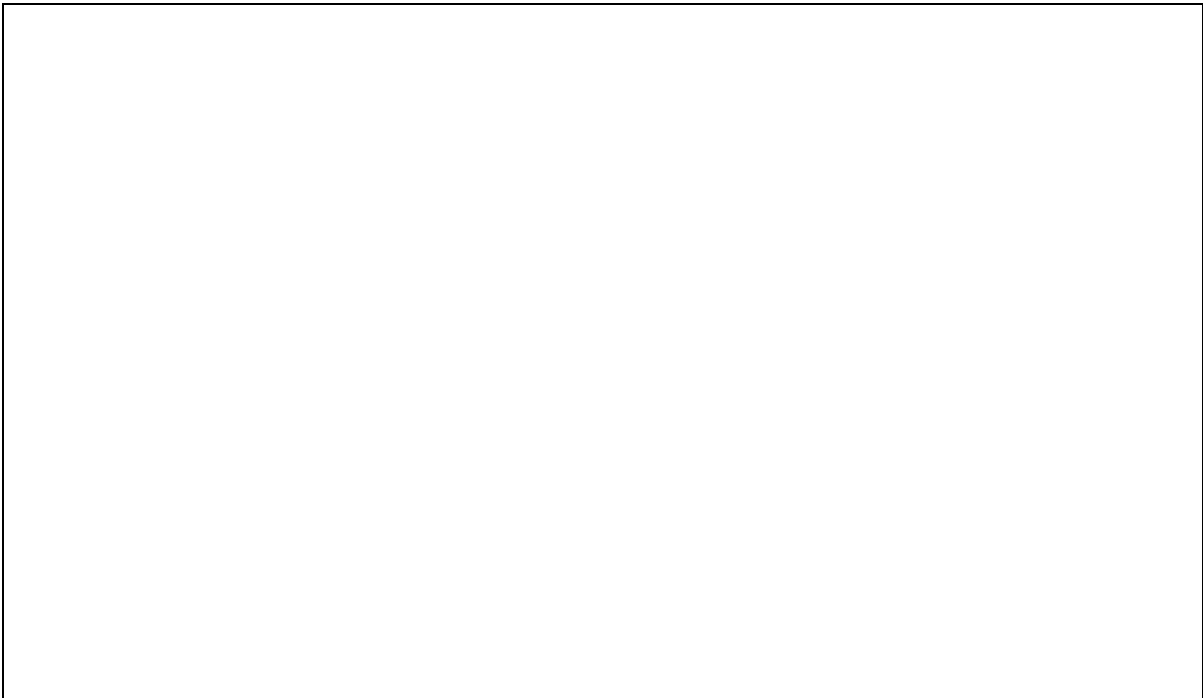
Cha-Ching! You have just inherited an entire county from your long lost great, great aunt. Well, the excitement is over and now it is time to get down to business. You need to rename your country (a title including your name is always a good choice). Being an outstanding artist, you have also been assigned the task of design the first currency of your new country. What should the money look like? Will it have your portrait? Will it show your friends? Your house? So many questions! Let's get to work.

Project criteria:

1. Create at least two thumbnail sketches that show how your money will look. You may use a compass or a ruler for the drawing. Get detailed and try different possibilities!
2. After choosing a design, begin by lightly drawing the money on the 8"x18" paper. Big money! Keep your lines light so that they may be erased later, or colored over with colored pencils. Look at the example on the handout. Notice how clean and detailed money really is? It takes a little bit of time to design money. Put some thought into this!
3. After your finish adding the details to the money, you may begin coloring the currency. Remember, money comes in all colors (not just green), so have fun with it. You will be graded most heavily on neatness.
4. Write your full name and period on the back of the assignment. Fill-out a self evaluation form and staple it to the artwork. Return it to the correct "To Be Graded" location.

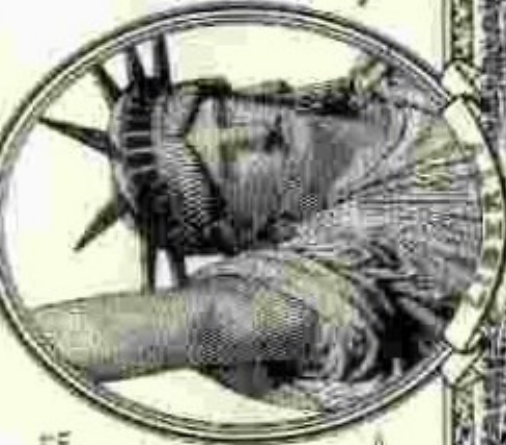
